### What Parents Need to Know About Common Core

The Maryland College and Career Ready Standards (MCCRS) have been implemented in all schools across the state. Maryland's new standards are based on the Common Core State Standards. MCCRS define the knowledge and skills all students should master by the end of each grade in order to graduate from high school fully prepared to enter the workforce and college. The Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) assessments will measure the higher order skills outlined in the new standards, such as critical thinking, communicating effectively, and problem solving.
